- In 2008-09 joined Ljubljana, Koper, Graz, Pécs, Krakow, Praha, Zadar, Novi Sad, Sarajevo, Mostar, Tuzla
- 2011- joined Skopje, Oradea, 2017- Brno, 2018 Nitra and Prishtina, 2023-Tirana, Sofia, Nikšić, 2024-Bratislava (UK), Budapest (Corvinus), Gdańsk
- I am coordinator from 2019 (but was from very beginning)
- Currently 25 members from 15 countries
