



Context I.


- Supports the relevance, quality, modernisation and responsiveness of Higher Education Institutions for socioeconomic recovery, growth and prosperity.
- Reacts to recent trends, in particular economic globalisation, but also the recent decline in human development, fragility, and rising social, economic and environmental inequalities exacerbated by the COVID-19 crisis.
- Aligned with the 'Sustainable Development Goals' (SDGs) and the Paris Agreement.

Context II.

- Ensures equity, accessibility and inclusion, system strengthening and capacity building, as well as employability transversally across the action.
- Global interventions that take into account governance, management and the strengthening of higher education's wider economic and social ecosystems.
- Addresses regional issues, build alliances and coalitions, pilot new approaches and initiatives built on country ownership.



Types of CBHE projects



Three types



At least 2 HEIs from two countries associated to Erasmus+ (EU Member States and other Programme countries)

+And for the partner countries in the National projects



Who can apply?



- Higher Education Institutions (HEIs)
- Associations or organisations of HEIs

Applicant must be established in a EU Member state or third country associated to the Erasmus+ programme (Programme Country), or in an eligible third country not associated to Erasmus+ programme (Partner Country)

The applicant applies on behalf of all participating organisations involved in the proposal

Eligible partners

- any public or private organisation recognised as **HEI** by the competent authorities of their country(ies)
- any public or private organisation active in the labour market or in the fields of education, training and youth
- Associations or organisations of HEIs dedicated to the promotion, improvement and reform of higher education as well as to co-operation within Europe and between Europe and other parts of the world
- International governmental organisations on a self-financing basis.

Award criteria

- Proposals must score at least 60/100 points in total to be selected
- At least half of the maximum points for each award criterion
- In case of equal score, priority to proposals scoring highest under "Relevance of the project" and then "Sustainability, impact and dissemination of the expected results".





Applications must be submitted through the European Commission's Funding & Tender Opportunities Portal (F&TP) using the Portal Submission System:








Are you interested in Erasmus Mundus but not yet ready for an EMJM?



Start with an Erasmus Mundus Design Measure and launch the basis for a joint programme!

What is the rationale behind Erasmus Mundus Design Measure?



- Fill the gap of the Erasmus Mundus Action by supporting the development of new master programmes
- Diversify the offer of Joint Master Programmes and encourage under-represented Erasmus+ Programme Countries, institutions, and/or thematic areas

EMDM is...



- a short duration grant to support institutions in the set-up of a new joint master programme in Europe (and beyond)
- one beneficiary mobilising a group of other HEIs
- fixed duration of 15 months
- fixed single lump sum contribution of € 55.000

Expected outcomes of EMDM I.



The jointly designed master should:

Offer a fully integrated curriculum delivered by a consortium:

involving at least three HEIs from three different countries, of which at least two must be EU Member States or third countries associated to the Programme (Partner Country)


- Aim at attracting excellent students worldwide
- Include physical mobility for all recruited students
- Lead to either a Joint degree or multiple degrees

Expected outcomes of EMDM II.



- joint programme design and joint procedures
- joint administrative and financial management
- common services offered to students
- joint **promotion** and dissemination
- a draft joint Partnership and Student Agreement
- joint degree policy and launch of accreditation process

Taking part as an INSTITUTION



- Any public and private organisation in Programme or Partner countries
- Applications: submitted by any eligible HEI from Programme or Partner country
- Programme country HEIs:

valid ECHE ,The Erasmus Charter for Higher Education'
