



- Visa and invitation matters (in) Embassy locations
- Bank account and currency issues (in)
- Accommodation (out)
- Personal contact important (in & out)
- Staff mobility as facilitator (in & out)
- Avoid conflict regions (in & out)
- Follow host instructions carefully (out)
