- Offer the students a safe space to spend time outdoors and do handson work to relieve their anxiety and fear caused by the uncertainty of the lockdown measures.
- Provide healthy, fresh and affordable food to the international students who stay at the dormitory during the quarantine time.
- Deliver non-formal leadership training to the students.
- Raise awareness about social and environmental issues.


#### Call to students

## **Environmental Results**


#### Clean, low impact and biological agricultural practices.



**Diversity:** 68 different varieties of 42 species of plants that attracted many pollinators, use of compost for a living soil.







Educated and aware citizens can make better decisions; thus, it has positive impacts on the environment.



#### **Economic Results**

In a little more than 4 months the garden produced about 700kg of food with a commercial value of approximately 750000HUF.

## Social Results

- Social recognition and connection with the local community. Broadcast in local newspaper.
- Recognition of the university.

## Lessons learnt (cont')

"Now when I go to the market, I can not see the products in the same way. Now I know how much time and effort they need to grow. Now I value food more and I do not waste"

"When you said that you will grow food without any pesticide, I wanted to see you make it happen. I saw it and now I am a believer"
