

Erasmus Mundus

- Action 1 joint programmes (2004-2014):
 - 242 Masters and 43 Doctorate programmes
 - More than 700 scholarships for students, doctoral candidates and scholars from WB countries.
- Action 2 partnerships (2007-2014):
 - 19 partnerships for WB countries
 - Scholarships for over 2500 students and 500 staff



BUDGETS AND NUMBER OF PROJECTS FUNDED

Tempus

- EUR 254 million allocated for 1991 2013
- 720 projects funded for 1991 2013

Marie Skłodowska-Curie

- **EUR 4.5 million** EU contribution (2007-2014)
- 264 researchers from Western Balkans (2007-2014)

Jean Monnet

- EUR 0.5 Million EU contribution (2007-2014)
- 14 projects funded for 2007-2014



Erasmus Mundus Action 2 Partnerships


Instances of participation HEIs in WB 2008-2014




Implemented per nationality – EU (2008 – 2013)






Action 1 Joint Masters and Doctorates (2004-2013)





Geographic Breakdown of the Number of Tempus Projects / Budget Allocation (1990-2013)






2007-2013: 149 TEMPUS projects involving WB






Privileged links example Bosnia and Herzegovina and Albania Tempus IV
