- There is a room for development in cooperation between our countries
- Building on past experiences, personal and professional contacts
- Expanding financial resources for internationalisation
- Erasmus+ programme is offering funding for the enhancement of international cooperation

- Tempus Public Foundation is the National Agency for Erasmus+ in Hungary
 - →Services provided not only for Hungarian stakeholders but also for Partner countries
 - →Engaging in the Erasmus+ programme
- Expertise peer learning for the development of HEIs and HE systems
 - Conferences, seminars, trainigs



ERASMUS+ THE PROGRAMME OUTLINE

- 2014-2020 flagship European programme for education and training
 - Learning mobility of individuals
 - Cooperation projects
 - Support for policy reform
- Integrates former Erasmus, Erasmus Mundus, Tempus and several other programmes
- Stronger international dimension: cooperation with Partner countries
- AL, BIH, XK, ME, RS: Partner countries
- HR, MK (FYROM), HU: Programme countries



ERASMUS+ IN FIGURES

- Total budget: 14,7 billion EUR, 43% for HE
- Goals:
 - 4 million participants: 2 million students, 800 000 teachers & staff in higher education
 - 25 000 scholarships for Erasmus Mundus Joint Master Degree students (esp. from partner countries)
 - 21 000 projects





HOW TO ENGAGE IN ERASMUS+?

- Finding a Hungarian partner university
- Leading /Becoming a member in a consortium
- Possible actions:
 - Mobility (to and from Hungary):
 - Full degree master students (Erasmus Mundus)
 - International credit mobility of students (3-12 months)
 - Exchange of teaching and administrative staff
 - Cooperation projects (KA2)





- Large projects implemented by a consortium of EU and non-EU members (500 000 - 1 000 000 EUR)
- 2 or 3 years
- Aim at the modernisation of HE and HE systems in partner countries
- Capacity-Building Projects are transnational cooperation projects based on multilateral partnerships primarily between higher education institutions (HEIs) from Programme and eligible Partner Countries

- Additional mobility component for WB:
 - Students: study (3-12 months) or traineeship (2-12 months)
 - Staff: teaching or training (5 days to 2 months)
 - to and from EU,
 - same rules as for credit mobility (max. 12 months)
- Complementary for Joint and Structural projects





ERASMUS MUNDUS JOINT MASTER DEGREES

- Large projects implemented by a consortium of EU and nonEU members to run a joint master programme
- Involves at least 3 HEIs from 3 different programme countries
- Partner countries can participate
- Joint master programme:
 - Innovative, multidisciplinary, excellent
 - Ends with a joint or multiple/double degree
 - Involves non-academic partners (cf. Employability)
- 5 years, 2-2,5 milion EUR
- Lump sum for management 170 000 €
- Scholarships for students (for the whole programme) and scholars (guest lecturers)
- EU support for the participation fees of students (paid directly to the consortium)

JEAN MONNET ACTIVITIES

Aims:

 To promote excellence in European integration studies in higher education


Main activities:

- Teaching and research (Chairs, Modules & Centres of Excellence)
- Policy debate with academic world and exchanges (networks and projects)
- Support to institutions or associations
- Funding:
 - From 30 000 to 300 000 EUR



MOBILITY – WHY?

- Impact of mobility
 - Employability of individuals, personal, linguistic and multicultural skills and competences
 - Development of HEIs:
 - Services
 - Curriculum
 - Teaching
 - Management
 - Recognition of studies
 - Quality improvement

ERASMUS+ INTERNATIONAL CREDIT MOBILITY

- 135,000 scholarships between 2015-2020 on EU level
 - For Hungary approx. 2,7 Million EUR /year
 around 430 scholarships/ year 80 for Western-Balkans
- For students and staff (academics and administrative)
- For incoming and outgoing
- All levels of students
- 3-12 months for students
- 5-60 days for staff (plus travel)
- Mobilities based on inter-institutional agreements to set mobility flows & preconditions- signed before mobilities start





ERASMUS+ QUALITY FRAMEWORK

- The principles of Erasmus HE Charter have to be applied:
 - Non discrimination
 - Full recognition of studies
 - No fees charged
 - Publish course catalogues
 - Good preparation of mobile students (language, documents, logistics)
 - Assistance for visas, accommodation, insurance
 - Guidance to incoming participants
 - Equal academic treatment & services
 - Integration into the local society
 - Mentoring
 - Linquistic support





ERASMUS+ INTERNATIONAL CREDIT MOBILITY

- 750 euro/month for incoming students to Hungary
- 650 euro/month for outgoing students from Hungary
- 140 euro/day for incoming staff to Hungary (if <14 days)
- 160 euro/day for outgoing staff from Hungary (if <14 days)
- Top-up travel cost for each participant
 - 100 and 499 KM: 180 EUR/person
 - 500 and 1999 KM: 275 EUR/person
 - 2000 and 2999 KM: 360 EUR/person
 - 3000 and 3999 KM: 530 EUR/person
 - 4000 and 7999 KM: 820 EUR/person
 - 8000 KM and above: 1100 EUR/ person





ERASMUS+ INTERNATIONAL CREDIT MOBILITY

Organisational support

- 350 euro / person paid to the applicant HEI
- can be shared between partners based on the agreement
- in case of both outgoing and incoming mobility
- 16 or 24 months to organise the mobilities
- Hungarian HEIs apply on behalf of the partners to Tempus Public Foundation (1st deadline 4 March 2015)

- Ask for assistance of TPF or the National Erasmus+ Office in your country:

 - Study visit to Hungary
