EFFeCT – European Methodological Framework for facilitating Teachers' Collaborative Learning

April 25th 2018 (15:00 CET)



The main focus of the 2,5-year-long EFFeCT project was to improve teacher competencies through enhanced opportunities for **teachers' collaborative learning** (CTL) by promoting networking and professional collaboration between teachers and other educational stakeholders (teacher trainers, school leaders, educational decision-makers and developers etc.).

Our webinar will focus on the results of the EFFeCT project by presenting the Methodological Framework of CTL and the online Resource Pool which will help the above mentioned stakeholders in the planning and the implementation of professional development processes.

Participants will also have the possibility to get an insight into EFFeCT webpage, where beyond the publishing of the research results, a structured Guidelines of CTL for facilitators, a CTL-Glossary and a CTL-Library has also been developed for giving guidance to the audience.

Speakers of the event:

Mika Risku will be the moderator of the event.

He is the head of Institute of Educational Leadership at the University of Jyväskylä. Finland

Philip Woods will present the research and development process of the EFFeCT project.

He is a professor of Educational Policy and the director of the Centre for Educational Leadership, University of Hertfordshire, United Kingdom

His main responsibilities are research into educational leadership and policy, with a focus on distributed leadership, equity, organisational democracy and change towards more democratic environments fostering collaborative and holistic learning.

Glynn Kirkham will present the Methodological Framework for facilitating Teachers' Collaborative learning for the first time to the public and summarises the Czech pilot programme.

He is a former teacher, headteacher, inspector of schools, university teacher, author, consultant in education, doctoral supervisor, now expert of the National Institute for Continuous Professional Development, Czech Republic

Teresa O'Doherty will speak about the Resource Pool and demonstrate one element of it to the audience. She is a Professor and Dean of Education at Mary Immaculate College, Ireland

Eszter Szegedi will tell the audience the specificities of the Hungarian Pilot programme.

She is the leader of the EFFeCT project and other international projects in the field of European educational policy. Tempus Public Foundation, Hungary

Rolands Ozols will also summarise the Latvian pilot process,

He is the Head and Leading Education Expert of the Institute of Lifelong Learning and Culture "VITAE". In his professional career he has been a teacher, school administrator, in-service teacher trainer of different informal and non-formal programmes, as well as an author of various methodological guidelines about teaching and learning process.

In his international career used to be a Secretary General of the Latvian National Commission for UNESCO, national coordinator of UNESCO Associated School Project Network and international coordinator of the Education for All network of the Baltic Sea subregion. Currently is a licencee of the FranklinCovey Education in Latvia.
